

## **The 2019 Laureate for the Banque de France Prize for Young Researchers in Green Finance is Mrs Fanny Henriet, a researcher affiliated with the Paris School of Economics and CNRS**

In 2018, the Banque de France decided to create a Prize for Young Researchers in Green Finance. As in 2018, the Prize was awarded this year on the occasion of the academic conference 'Green Finance Research Advances', co-organised by Banque de France and Institut Louis Bachelier on 25 November 2019, with the participation of the Institute for Climate Economics -I4CE- and Finance for Tomorrow, as a side event of the Paris Climate Finance week.

The Prize was awarded by Mr Ivan Odonnat, Deputy General Director, Financial Stability and Operations General Directorate: "I am very pleased to observe, this year like last year, the quality of the applications that have been submitted to the assessment of Banque de France Prize's international selection committee<sup>[2]</sup>, Mr Odonnat declared, 'I warmly congratulate **Mrs Fanny Henriet** for her project, which is about the effects of the introduction of a carbone price on the value of fossil-fuel reserves, at the international level', a core issue for regulators. This Prize underlines the importance that Banque de France gives to advances in academic research on Green Finance in France."

The 2019 Laureate, Mrs Fanny Henriet, a young researcher at **Paris School of Economics and CNRS** follows the nomination of Mr Louis-Gaëtan Giraudet in 2018 for his project regarding the analysis of zero interest loans that are adopted in a growing number of countries (France, Germany, Japan) to incentivize real estate energy efficiency renovation.
